- The Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control (DNREC) has posted a survey to solicit input from communities, organizations, and interested parties on potential dredging projects. Information received will be used by DNREC to help identify and prioritize dredging needs. Please click [here](#) to participate in their short survey.
